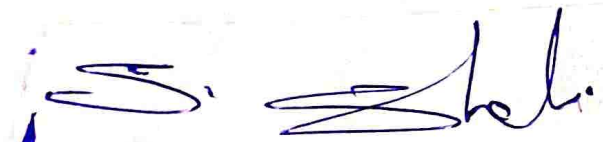
- i) In the case of the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the Company as at 31st March 2022;

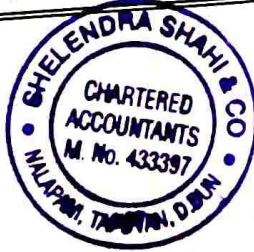

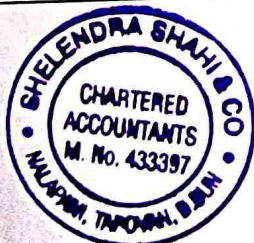
